The West African Economic and Monetary Union (UEMOA), French acronym of Union Economique et Monétaire de l'Afrique de l'Ouest, has been created by the Treaty signed in Dakar on 10 January 1994 by the Heads of States and Governments of the seven West African countries having in common money unit, the French CFA: Benin, Burkina Faso, Ivory Coast, Mali, Niger, Senegal et Togo, formerly French colonies..

The Treaty came into force, on 1st August 1994, once ratified by all their Member States.

On 2nd May 1997, Guinea-Bissau became the 8th Member State of the Union.
